

# Why Is LGBTQ+ Inclusion Important for IPM Professionals?


- IPM Involves: Supporting people to manage pests while reducing risk

## Who Are We?


- LGBTQ+ folks have always existed

- **Queer** is also often used as an umbrella term by the LGBTQ+ community
  - Caution this is a reclaimed word!

# Why Care About LGBTQ+ Inclusion?

#### • Rights infringed in US:

- 474 anti-LGBTQ+ bills in the US
  - Schools and education
  - Free speech and expression
  - Health care
  - Civil rights
- Discrimination in US:
- 42-68% percent of LGBTQ+ individuals report experiencing employment discrimination
- 19% transgender people reported being refused a home/apartment & 11% reported eviction due to their ID
- Mental & Emotional Health:
- 45% LGBTQ+ youth seriously considered suicide in 2021

# Be an Ally

- Educate yourself
- Speak up at injustice
- Be honest and open
- Support equality
- Listen with respect
- Honor others' experiences
- Ask questions instead of making assumptions
- Never ask or assume someone's gender, sexuality, identity, orientation
- Do ask for gender pronouns
  - Use they/them until specified
- Do ask for names and use the name that person prefers
- When you make mistakes or are corrected, use grace



# LGBTQ+ Joy

- Self-love and pride
- Community, chosen family
- Freedom to flourish outside of harmful societal constructs
- As allies make room for LGBTQ+ joy





# Shared Conversation Norms

- Listen with curiosity, openness, and without interrupting.
- Share and explain only your own ideas and perspectives.
- Respect confidentiality & privacy: share lessons, careful with specifics and details.
- Respect one another's ideas, even if they are different.
- Be open to feedback and encourage reflection.
- Assume good intentions.
- Acknowledge when something harmful is said & allow others to apologize.
