Which Partnership Type Applies to My Project?

IPM Applied Research

Identifies gap in knowledge that prevents IPM adoption Designs experiment(s) to build knowledge Presents/publishes results, including to extension/outreach colleagues/community

Results in new knowledge or practices that improve efficacy of IPM IPM Working Groups

Identifies and convenes stakeholders around defined topic Identifies gaps in knowledge, adoption of practices, or

communication

Develops plan for addressing gaps (for example: white paper, proposal, conference)

Results in new or enhanced efforts to advance adoption of IPM IPM Communications

Identifies an audience(s) that lack knowledge of IPM

Synthesizes knowledge and research results

Disseminates information by methods appropriate to identified audiences

Educates

Results in changes in behavior or conditions, specifically adoption of IPM

Pest Management Strategic Plan (PMSP) or Production/Management Profile (PMP)

Proposals must develop a Pest Management Strategic Plan (PMSP) or Production/Management Profile (PMP) for a crop, livestock enterprise, pet, forestry, aquatic system, turf/playing fields/golf courses/park, medical practice, schools/buildings or other pest management application that is significant to the Northeast.

Proposals to develop PMSPs or PMPs for crops, livestock, forestry, or other systems that do not have a plan or to update outdated PMSPs or PMPs (more than five years old) are encouraged.

Pest Management Strategic Plan (PMSP) or Production/Management Profile (PMP)

The Center is particularly interested in PMP/PMSP proposals for

- a) low-bush/wild blueberries
- b) greenhouse food crops—including fruiting vegetables, greens, hydroponic production, etc.
- c) hemp
- d) Integrated Vegetation Management (IVM), such as rights-of-way



Changes for 2022

- * Release of PMSP/PMP RFA
- * 12 month projects
- Lower funding amount to account for 12 month timeline
- * Evaluation

Evaluation

- Improve your chances of receiving IPM funding by carefully describing:
- 1. Your evaluation plan objectives, indicators, and methods.
- 2. How the evaluation objectives meet the IPM Road Map goals.
- * Ultimately, we strive to measure changes in behaviors and conditions that increase IPM implementation.
